## Facts about the Great Fire of London:

- The fire started on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of September 1666 and lasted for four days.
- The king at the time was King Charles II.
- Only 6 people died in the fire, but 13 thousand lost their belongings and homes.
- The fire was so hot it melted the lead roof of Saint Pauls Cathedral.
