## Fun Facts about knights:

1. The earliest knights (ninth century) were men who protected a lord and his peasants. Two centuries later, knights had formed their own social order. This culture of honor, bravery, and battle continued into the 16th century.
2. As part of the feudalistic system, a knight would receive an estate in exchange for his military service. This estate was known as a fief.
3. Sons born of noble families and who were slated to become knights were sent away at the age of seven to live in the house of a lord or uncle. There, they would become pages and begin their knight training.
4. At the age of fourteen, a page became a squire, and began to apprentice under a knight. As squires, the boys trained constantly in order to condition their bodies and perfect their weaponry skills. Many boys were winnowed out during the squire stage because the training was so difficult.
