

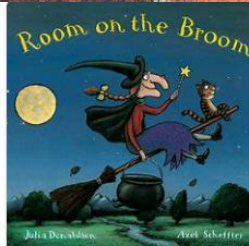
Autumn Two-Term Year 1

English

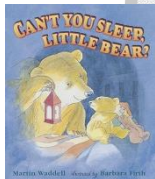
We will be using simple sentences to recall stories and remembering to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

Other books we will be using as a hook for our writing are, Room on a Broom, Can't you sleep little bear and Jack and the Beanstalk.

We are reading...



We will be reading a number of other books, including some non-fiction and poetry books. We will continue to use our phonic knowledge to help decode words and build up our high frequency words so that we can both read and write them. We will also make simple pictures in our heads when listening to someone reading to us.



Maths

We are learning to:

Addition and subtraction within 10:
We will be using the part - whole model to see how numbers within 10 can be partitioned. We will solve one-step problems involving addition and subtraction, using concrete objects, pictorial representations and addition (+) subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
Recognise 2D and 3D shapes

Science

We are learning to:

We will be identifying, naming, drawing and labelling the basic parts of the human body. We will also say which part of the body is associated with each sense-smell, hear, feel, touch, taste. We will be identifying and classifying groups of animals. We will be learning to identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, omnivores and herbivores. Finally, we will be learning to draw, label, and name parts of animals.

Art

We are learning to:

- Print using a range of objects
- Repeat shapes and overlap them to create a picture
- Use the skills of press, roll, rub and stamp to print an image



History

We are learning to:

Historically, we are focusing on Florence Nightingale and the impact she had on modern nursing all around the world. We will know what Florence Nightingale is remembered for and list some of her achievements. We will also compare her with Mary Seacole. We will look at artefacts from the past and compare these to the present. We will use words and phrases relating to the passing of time. We will also have a visit from Florence Nightingale!
